

All groups wishing to use Camp Barnard must fully complete all applicable paperwork and payment of deposit payable to Scouts Canada -- Camp Barnard. Non-Scout groups must also sign this Rules form, the Hold Harmless form and provide proof of insurance. All shared areas or facilities should be pre-booked and confirmed with the Camp Ranger upon arrival. This applies to areas such as the waterfront, field areas, amphitheatre, chapel, archery range, disc golf, etc.

The Discretion of the Camp Ranger shall prevail in all matters of conduct and safety. Ensure all campers know the rules.

Check-In and Check-Out: Check-in time is 3:00pm and check-out time is 1:00pm. Please advise Registrar if you wish to come to camp early or stay late. Groups must check-in with the Ranger upon arrival and complete the check-out process before departure.

Alcohol and Drugs: Alcoholic beverages are not permitted at Camp Barnard without a Liquor Licence. Recreational use of marijuana is not permitted at Camp Barnard. Alcoholic beverages may be allowed but only where specific permission has been given in writing and a liquor licence has been obtained.

Animals: Only certified therapy and assistance animals are welcomed.

Fire Safety: Camp lanterns, stoves, and heaters are NOT allowed in any cabin or tent. Fires are only permitted in designated fire-pits with sufficient water buckets in close proximity. Fire restrictions may be enforced by the Camp Ranger. Fire exits must not be blocked.

Parking: **Maintain a clear FIRE LANE at all times.** Parking is only allowed in the designated parking lot. Temporary parking (maximum 15 minutes) is allowed on the main road beyond the parking lot for drop-off or pick-up only. Trailers and other recreational vehicles are limited to the main parking lot and the open area at the beginning of the Mt. Bluff Trail. The road beyond the gate at the base of the Mt. Bluff Trail is restricted to service vehicles or as approved by the Camp Ranger. DO NOT drive vehicles "Off Road" in Camp.

Young Lake: All water related activities must be conducted meeting BP&P standards. Applicable regulations are posted at the waterfront and on the boathouse. Adult or certified supervision is required for all water activities.

Emergencies: The Camp Ranger must be notified within 20 minutes if someone is missing or injured to the point of requiring Professional Emergency Assistance. If no one is available at Camp, contact Emergency Services at **9 – 1 – 1**.

Health and Safety

- Scouters or Group Leaders are responsible for the health, safety, and conduct of their Group, including visitors.
- Groups are required to provide their own First Aider and First Aid supplies.
- Drinking water must be obtained only from designate sources. Lake and stream water is unsafe.
- Firearms and fireworks are prohibited.
- Archery equipment or slingshots may only be used in accordance with BP&P in areas designated by Camp Ranger.

Respect for the Environment and Others

- Only trees designated by the Camp Ranger may be cut down
- Power tools such as chainsaws are not to be used by camping groups
- Do not use nails, tacks, or staples on any building, tree, or post
- The Chapel is for the use of all faiths and is not a play area
- All campers are asked to observe quiet time after **10pm until 7:00am**.

Clean Up Responsibilities

- Please operate by Leave No Trace principles. Leave things as you found them or in BETTER shape.
- Charges will be added to cover damages to camp equipment, buildings, or property.
- All garbage is to be removed and placed in properly secured garbage bags and placed in bin in parking lot.
- All groups are required to either take their recycling with them or to sort it in the recycling shed.
- Composters are located near the recycling shed. Please use them.
- Groups are responsible for clean-up of all facilities and areas used and returning furniture/equipment to original location.
- All items brought to camp must be removed
- Contact person must ensure that everything is completed and checked by the Camp Ranger.
- The Responsible person must ensure that all members of their group are off the premises before they leave Camp.
